OAE was pleased to host an exciting weekend of dance on May 16 and 17 as the *Having a Ball*, ballroom dance intensive program came to a close for the year. Over 160 couples from the 15 participating CPS schools competed in the International Style of ballroom dance, displaying an impressive amount of achievement and dedication. Congratulations to Eric Kasprzyk and Angieszka Suminski of Oriole Park who placed first, Jamari Bryant and D'Kyra Long of Attucks Academy, placing second; Timothy Grzebieluch and Allyson Abbinanti of Oriole Park, placing third; Eric Quinones and Raven Jones of New Sullivan, placing fourth; and Jawaun Lee and Ketyra Carter and Hasaan P. Morris and Janell Island all of Attucks Academy, placing fifth and sixth. All of the couples who danced during the weekend did an incredible job and made tough work for the judges.

The program was fortunate to receive both local and national attention last month. It was featured on [NBC Nightly News](#) with Brian Williams as part of the *Making a Difference* series, and regionally on [ABC](#), [NBC](#) and CBS among others.
